- Share knowledge, experience, good practices, and lessons & improve partnerships for better design and delivery of FLN policies and strategies.
- Strengthen consist use of data, research, and findings around FLN.
- Get consensus and commitment from African policymakers and educational stakeholders to implement proposed reforms on FLN.

Expected Outcomes:

- COVID-19 impact on FLN informs future initiatives.
- Mutual agreement on practical and innovative solutions on FLN.
- Mechanisms for improving stakeholder partnerships to advance FLN.
- Modalities for consistent use of data, research, and study findings on FLN foundational learning are strengthened.
- African policymakers commit to replicate successful reforms around FLN, in line with the TES commitments and call to action.

FLN in Africa: ISSUES TO CONSIDER

Addressing Learning poverty.

- 1. Learning loss and inequality aggravated by school closures.
- 2. Inappropriate teaching and learning environment.
- 3. Low motivation and inadequate levels of qualified teaching staff.
- 4. Low investment in Basic Education and teaching resources.
- 5. Inadequate curriculum reforms and early introduction of STEM and vocational courses.
- 6. Inappropriate psychosocial health and well-being for teachers and students.
- 7. Under-developed remote learning
- 8. Weak governance and utilization of national data, research and study findings.

- 1. Focusing on foundational skills, including language of instruction and social and emotional development in ECD.
- 2. Introducing mathematics and creativity through playbased STEM for early learners.
- 3. Teaching to improve learning –structured pedagogy and remediation.
- 4. Data and assessment informed instruction.
- 5. Improving learning recovery (increasing catch-up learning and progress beyond what was lost due to COVID-19).
- 6. Community involvement in foundational learning.

Cross-cutting: (1) data management and utilization; (2) gender, (3) equity, (4) inclusion; (5) education financing, and (6) use of ICT in education.
